DEWORMING is an important part of the gamefowl conditioning process. It rids the animal's body of internal parasites such as roundworms, cecal worms, and tapeworms that feed on nutrients and deprive the host of nourishment necessary for optimum health and development.

For best results, choose a dewormer that is broadspectrum, or effective against common internal parasites.
